


## ALBION FALLS SOUTH ACCESS AND VIEWING PLATORM SURVEY SUMMARY


ITEM	DISCUSSION
1.0	Visitor Summary
1.1	1,706 online visitors viewed one project page associated with the Albion Falls South Viewing and Access Project. These online visitors are considered "Aware".
1.2	556 online visitors viewed multiple project pages and links associated with the Albion Falls South Viewing and Access Project. The online visitors are considered "Informed".
1.3	219 online visitors completed the survey. These online visitors are considered "Engaged".
1.4	376 was the maximum number of online visitors to the project page in one day.
1.5	Most online visitors accessed the Albion Falls South Viewing and Access project page via Facebook.
2.0	Survey Summary
2.1	The following are the results of the online survey questions completed by 219 online visitors. The online survey was available on the Engage Hamilton platform. The survey launched November 18, 2020 and closed on January 31, 2021.
	The purpose of the survey was to understand why and how residents visit Albion Falls and to receive feedback on the new platform design and gauge project support.

	of wildlife and the natural environment, that the platform was too obstructive, that the area was already too busy and there was inadequate parking, concerns of increased traffic and visitors to the area.
3.0	Comments
3.1	The following is a summary of the most occurring comments received. A total of 137 comments were provided.
	<ol> <li>We received 27 comments that the design appeared too industrial and obtrusive and there was a desire for the design to blend in with the natural environment more.</li> </ol>
	a. Response: the City will review the design to ensure that the design blends more with the surrounding environment.
	<ol> <li>There was concern about visitor parking and the increased attraction of the site from tourists. Comments included having paid parking for those that came from out of town and having parking passes for residents and having by-law enforcement during the summer months.</li> </ol>
	<ul> <li><b>a. Response:</b> the City will review the parking and consult with Hamilton Licensing and By-Law, Hamilton Tourism and Culture and Hamilton Transportation Planning and Parking.</li> </ul>
	<ol> <li>There was concern that the increase of tourism would increase garbage and foot- traffic. There was a desire to greater garbage control.</li> <li>a. Response: see response to item 2.</li> </ol>

	<ul> <li>4. There was a desire to see stairs go down to the base of the falls and provide access to the bottom.</li> <li>a. Response: the base of the falls sits within the regulatory flood limit and is subject to flash flooding. It is unsafe and unsuitable for public infrastructure to be building with the base of the falls and to lead visitors into this environment.</li> </ul>
	<ol> <li>There was a desire to see improved cycling routes along Mountain brow to connect the area to the rest of the City.</li> <li><b>a. Response:</b> per the transportation masterplan, the cycling path along Mountainbrow Boulevard is identified as "Upgrade to Paved trail."</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>There was a desire to see improved crossings and pedestrian networks.</li> <li>a. Response: A pedestrian crossover will be provided on Mountainbrow Boulevard in a location that is suitable to achieve vehicular sightlines and stopping distances to connect the Arbor Road parking lot to Albion Falls.</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>There was a desire to see more hiking trail and ensure that the current hiking trails are safe.</li> <li><b>a. Response:</b> the Mountainbrow side trail that connects Albion Falls to the Red hill parking lot will be reviewed.</li> </ol>
	<ul> <li>8. There was a desire to see more historical signage, trail etiquette signage and signage at the top of the stairs that indicated the difficulty rating to access the platform.</li> <li>a. Response: there will be signage at the top of the stairs to indicate difficulty rating and trail etiquette and historical and/or environmental signage will be explored.</li> </ul>
	<ol> <li>9. There was support for the idea and a desire to start construction as soon as possible.</li> <li>a. Response: Environmental studies are still on-going and construction funding still needs to be secured. The City is estimating that the platform and stair access will cost \$1.9M.</li> </ol>
