CITY OF HAMILTON

BY-LAW NO.15-138

Being a By-law to Establish a System of Administrative Penalties

WHEREAS the City of Hamilton is authorized under the *Municipal Act, 2001* to establish a system of administrative penalties for contraventions of City of Hamilton by-laws;

AND WHEREAS the *Municipal Act, 2001* further authorizes the City of Hamilton, amongst other things, to delegate its authority and to impose fees or charges;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the City of Hamilton enacts as follows:

Definitions

1. In this By-law:

“administrative penalty” includes any administrative fee that has been added to an administrative penalty;

“City” means the geographical area of the City of Hamilton or the municipal corporation as the context requires;

“Designated By-law” means a by-law or part of a by-law listed in Schedule A to this By-law;

“Hearing Officer” means an individual appointed by City Council under authority of this By-law for the purpose of considering appeals of administrative penalties and carrying out any other duties in accordance with this By-law;

“Officer” means an individual appointed by or under authority of a City by-law to enforce a Designated By-law;

“person” includes an individual or a corporation and their authorized representative;

“Screening Officer” means an individual appointed by the City for the purpose of reviewing administrative penalties and carrying out any other duties in accordance with this By-law; and

“Senior Director” means the City of Hamilton’s Senior Director of Parking and By-law Services and his or her designate or successor.

Scope

2. This By-law applies to the Designated By-laws.
3. Any Designated By-law respecting the parking, standing or stopping of vehicles is designated for the purposes of paragraph 3(1)(b) of Ontario Regulation 333/07.
4. The *Provincial Offences Act* applies to all Designated By-laws except to a Designated By-law respecting the parking, standing or stopping of vehicles.
5. Screening Officers conducting a review under this By-law and Hearing Officers conducting an appeal under this By-law do not have jurisdiction to consider any question relating to the validity of a statute, regulation or by-law including but not limited to the constitutional applicability or operability of any statute, regulation or by-law.

Penalty Notice

6. Every person who contravenes a Designated By-law shall be liable, upon issuance of a penalty, to pay an administrative penalty in an amount specified in Schedule A to this By-law.
7. An Officer who has reason to believe that a person has contravened a Designated By-law may issue a penalty notice to that person.
8. A penalty notice shall include the following information:
 - (a) the date of the contravention;
 - (b) the date of issuance of the penalty notice;
 - (c) a reference number that is unique to the penalty notice;
 - (c) particulars of the contravention;
 - (d) the amount of the administrative penalty;
 - (e) information that the Senior Director determines is appropriate respecting the process for requesting a review of administrative penalty; and
 - (f) a statement that the administrative penalty unless cancelled as a result of the review or appeal processes, constitutes a debt to the City.
9. A person who has been issued a penalty notice shall:
 - (a) pay the administrative penalty; or
 - (b) request the administrative penalty be reviewed by a Screening Officer in accordance with section 14,
no later than 15 days after the penalty notice's date of issuance.
- 10.(1) Despite section 9, a person may request that a Screening Officer extend the time to:
 - (a) pay the administrative penalty; or

- (b) request the administrative penalty be reviewed by a Screening Officer in accordance with section 14,
from 16 days to no later than 45 days after the penalty notice's date of issuance.
- (2) A Screening Officer may extend the time to:
- (a) pay, if the person demonstrates, on a balance of probabilities, the existence of extenuating circumstances that prevented the person from making the payment in accordance with subsection 9(a);
 - (b) request a review, if the person demonstrates, on a balance of probabilities, the existence of extenuating circumstances that prevented the person from requesting the review in accordance with subsection 9(b).
- (3) The Screening Officer may request such information from a person as the Screening Officer considers relevant to a request to extend the time to pay or a request to extend the time to request a review.
11. If a person who has been issued a penalty notice has not acted in accordance with sections 9 or 10, then:
- (a) they are deemed to have waived their right to request a review;
 - (b) the administrative penalty is payable no later than 45 days after the penalty notice's date of issuance; and
 - (c) the administrative penalty is not subject to any further review or appeal, including a review or appeal to any court.
12. If a person who has been issued a penalty notice has requested an extension of time to pay the administrative penalty in accordance with section 10, then:
- (a) they are deemed to have waived their right to request a review;
 - (b) the administrative penalty is payable no later than:
 - (i) the date as determined by the Screening Officer; or
 - (ii) 45 days after the penalty notice's date of issuance, whichever date is later; and
 - (c) the administrative penalty is not subject to any further review or appeal, including a review or appeal to any court.
13. If a person who has been issued a penalty notice has requested an extension of time to request the administrative penalty be reviewed in accordance with section 10 and the request is refused, then:
- (a) they are deemed to have waived their right to request a review;
 - (b) the administrative penalty is payable no later than 45 days after the penalty notice's date of issuance; and

- (c) the administrative penalty is not subject to any further review or appeal, including a review or appeal any court.

Review by Screening Officer

- 14. A person may request a review or request that a Screening Officer extend the time to pay or to request a review by attending at the location or locations as specified on the penalty notice.
- 15.(1) After considering a request to review, a Screening Officer may decide to
 - (a) affirm the administrative penalty;
 - (b) cancel the administrative penalty, if the person establishes on the balance of probabilities that he or she did not contravene the Designated By-law as set out in the penalty notice; or
 - (b) cancel, reduce or extend time for payment of the administrative penalty, if the person establishes on the balance of probabilities that this is necessary to relieve undue hardship.
- (2) The Screening Officer may request such information from a person as the Screening Officer considers relevant to a request to review.
- 16. A Screening Officer shall inform a person of his or her decision at the conclusion of a review.
- 17. Where a person fails to attend a review in accordance with section 14:
 - (a) they are deemed to have waived their right to request a review;
 - (b) the administrative penalty is payable no later than:
 - (i) the date scheduled; or
 - (ii) 45 days after the penalty notice's date of issuance, whichever date is later; and
 - (c) the administrative penalty is not subject to any further review or appeal, including a review or appeal to any court.

Appeal to Hearing Officer

- 18. A person may appeal a Screening Officer's decision by attending at the location or locations as specified on the penalty notice no later than 15 days after the date on which the Screening Officer's decision is given to them.
- 19.(1) Despite section 18, a person may request that a Hearing Officer extend the time to appeal from 16 days to no later than 30 days after the Screening Officer's decision has been given to them, if the person demonstrates, on a balance of probabilities, the existence of extenuating circumstances that prevented the person from appealing in accordance with section 18.
- (2) The Hearing Officer may request such information for a person as the Hearing Officer considers relevant to a request to extend the time to appeal.

- 20.(1) After considering an appeal, including hearing from the parties, a Hearing Officer may decide to:
- (a) affirm the Screening Officer's decision;
 - (b) cancel the administrative penalty, if the person establishes on the balance of probabilities that he or she did not contravene the Designated By-law as set out in the penalty notice; or
 - (b) cancel, reduce or extend time for payment of the administrative penalty, if the person establishes on the balance of probabilities that this is necessary to relieve undue hardship.
- (2) The Hearing Officer may request such information from a person as the Hearing Officer considers relevant to considering an appeal.
- 21.(1) The *Statutory Powers Procedure Act* applies to the consideration of an appeal by a Hearing Officer.
- (2) In addition to anything else that is admissible as evidence at an appeal in accordance with the *Statutory Powers Procedure Act*, the following are admissible as evidence as proof of the facts certified in them, in the absence of evidence to the contrary:
- (a) a certified statement of an Officer respecting a contravention;
 - (b) a certified copy of a document, including but not limited to a photograph taken by an Officer, respecting a contravention;
 - (c) a certified statement of an Officer that he or she served a document, with the date and method of service indicated.
- (3) If certified evidence referred to in subsection 21(2) is being admitted as evidence at an appeal, the Hearing Officer shall not adjourn the appeal for the purpose of having the Officer attend to give evidence unless the Hearing Officer is satisfied that the oral evidence of the Officer is necessary to ensure a fair appeal.
- 22.(1) A Hearing Officer shall give his or her decision to a person in writing.
- (2) If a Hearing Officer's decision affirms, reduces or extends the time to pay an administrative penalty, the administrative penalty is payable not later than:
- (a) the date as determined by the Hearing Officer;
 - (b) the date of the Hearing Officer's decision; or
 - (c) 30 days after the Screening Officer's decision,
- whichever date is later.
23. A Hearing Officer's decision is final and is not subject to any further review or appeal, including a review or appeal by any court.
24. If a person who has been given a Screening Officer's decision has not acted in accordance sections 18 or 19, then:

- (a) they are deemed to have waived their right to appeal;
 - (b) the Screening Officer's decision is affirmed;
 - (c) the administrative penalty is payable no later than:
 - (i) the date as determined by the Screening Officer; or
 - (ii) 30 days after the date of the Screening Officer's decision, whichever date is later; and
 - (d) the administrative penalty is not subject to any further review or appeal, including a review or appeal to any court.
25. If a Hearing Officer does not extend a person's time to appeal under section 19, then:
- (a) the Screening Officer's decision is affirmed;
 - (b) the administrative penalty is payable no later than:
 - (i) the date as determined by the Screening Officer;
 - (ii) the date of the Hearing Officer's decision; or
 - (iii) 30 days after the date of the Screening Officer's decision, whichever date is later; and
 - (c) the administrative penalty is not subject to any further review or appeal, including a review or appeal to any court.
26. If a person fails to attend at the date, time and place scheduled in accordance with section 18:
- (a) they are deemed to have waived their right to appeal;
 - (b) the Screening Officer's decision is affirmed;
 - (c) the administrative penalty is payable no later than:
 - (i) the date as determined by the Screening Officer;
 - (ii) the date scheduled; or
 - (iii) 30 days after the date of the Screening Officer's decision, whichever date is later; and;
 - (d) the administrative penalty is not subject to any further review or appeal, including a review or appeal to any court.

Administrative Penalties

27. An Officer cannot accept payment of an administrative penalty.
28. If a person's administrative penalty is paid, in whole or in part, then:
 - (a) they are deemed to have waived their right to request a review or to appeal; and
 - (b) the administrative penalty is not subject to any further review or appeal, including a review or appeal to any court.
29. An administrative penalty that is not paid on the date when it is payable is a debt to the City owed by the person to whom to penalty notice was given.
30. All administrative fees to be added to an administrative penalty under this By-law are as approved from the City's Council from time to time and included in the User Fees and Charges By-law.

Service of Documents

- 30.(1) The City may serve any document under this by-law, including but not limited to a penalty notice, personally or by facsimile transmission (fax), electronic transmission (email), registered or regular mail addressed to the person to whom the document is to be given at the person's last known number or address.
 - (2) Service by facsimile transmission (fax) or electronic transmission (email) under subsection 30(1) shall be deemed to have been made on the day on which the transmission is sent.
 - (3) Service by registered or regular mail under subsection 30(1) shall be deemed to have been made on the fifth day after the day of mailing.
 - (4) A person's last known number or address includes the number or address provided by the person to the City in the course of any transaction between the City and the person.
- 31.(1) In addition to the service of documents provided for under section 30, an Officer may serve the penalty notice for a contravention of a Designated By-law respecting the parking, standing or stopping of vehicles on the person who is the owner of the vehicle by:
 - (a) affixing the penalty notice to the vehicle in a conspicuous place; or
 - (b) giving it personally on the person who has care or control of the vehicle, at the time of the contravention.
- (2) Service under subsection 31(1) shall to be deemed to have been made at the time the penalty notice is affixed to the vehicle or given to the person.

Appointment of Hearing Officer

33. Council shall appoint eligible candidates:

- (a) with knowledge of and experience in administrative law; and
 - (b) of good character,
- as Hearing Officers.

34.(1) In this section “**family member**” means:

- (a) a child, which is a person born within or outside marriage and includes an adopted child and a person whom a parent has demonstrated a settled intention to treat as a child of his or her family;
- (b) a parent, which is a person who has demonstrated a settled intention to treat a child as a member of his or her family whether or not that person is the natural parent of the child; and
- (c) a spouse, which is a person to whom the person is married or with whom the person is living in a conjugal relationship outside of marriage;
- (d) a sibling, aunt, uncle, niece or nephew including a step-sibling, step-aunt, step-uncle, step-niece or step-nephew; or
- (e) a mother-in-law, father-in-law, sister-in-law or brother-in-law including a step-mother-in-law, step-father-in-law, step sister-in-law or step-brother-in-law.

(2) The following are not eligible for appointment as a Hearing Officer:

- (a) a City employee or a member of City Council;
- (b) a family member of a City employee;
- (c) a family member of a member of City Council;
- (b) a person indebted to the City unless the debt is for current real property taxes or as a result of an agreement with City under which the person is in compliance.

35. A Hearing Officer shall be appointed for the term or the remainder of term of the City Council that makes the appointment until the Hearing Officer is reappointed or a successor is appointed.

36. A Hearing Officer shall be remunerated at a rate established by City Council from time to time.

37. No person shall attempt, directly or indirectly, to communicate with or influence a Hearing Officer respecting an appeal except a person who is entitled to be heard during the appeal while the appeal is being heard.


38. Section 37 does not prevent a Hearing Officer from seeking and receiving legal advice.

39. A person who contravenes section 37 of this By-law is guilty of an offence and is liable, upon conviction, to the maximum fine as established under the *Provincial Offences Act*.

General Provisions

40. The Senior Director is responsible for administering the provisions of this By-law, including but not limited to prescribing the format and content of any forms or other documents required under this By-law.
41. The Senior Director may cancel an administrative penalty or any administrative fee that has been added to an administrative penalty or both:
- (a) if the administrative penalty or administration fee or both were imposed as the result of an error made by the City; or
 - (b) in the case of a contravention with respect to the parking, standing or stopping of a vehicle:
 - (i) if the person's licence plate or the vehicle had been stolen at the time of the contravention; or
 - (ii) at the request of an owner or occupant of the private property where the contravention took place.
42. Any time limit under this By-law that would otherwise expire on a day on which the City's administrative buildings are not open for business is extended to the next day on which the City's administrative building are open for business.
43. Schedule A forms part of this By-law.
44. This By-law may be referred to as the Administrative Penalty By-law or the Hamilton Administrative Penalty By-law.
45. If a court of competent jurisdiction declares any provision of this By-law invalid, it is the intention of Council that the remainder of the By-law shall continue to be in force.
46. This By-law comes into force at 12:00 p.m. (noon) on **August 23, 2015**.

4. Column 4 in the following tables sets out the administrative penalty payment for the contravention of the corresponding Designated By-law in Column 1, starting 8 days after the penalty notice is issued.
