The purpose of this Communications Update is to provide information on the recent release of the 2021 preliminary census population data for the City of Hamilton and the changes since 2016. The infographics included as Appendix "A" and Appendix "B" to this Communications Update lay out the change in population, number of occupied dwellings, and persons per unit by ward and community.

Key Highlights:

- City's population is up 6% to 569,355 in 2021 from 536,920 in 2016 (not including net under coverage rate of 2.8%);
- City's total occupied dwellings increased 5% to 222,805 in 2021 from 211,590 in 2016:
- City's fastest growing communities are Glanbrook and Stoney Creek; and,
- Wards 2, 9, 11, and 15 saw the greatest population growth and there was a minor population decline in Ward 13.

Growth Targets:

The City's 2021 population forecast (from Hemson Consulting "Greater Golden Horseshoe: Growth Forecasts to 2051", August 2020) was 584,000 persons. The data indicates that the City's 2021 population exceeded the forecast by 1,755 persons, with a total population of 584,755 persons. This includes the assumed net under coverage rate of 2.8%. The City's forecast of 222,540 occupied dwellings in 2021 has also been exceeded by 267 units.


TOTAL POPULATION

The number of occupied dwellings has increased by **11,205**






