### Municipal Election

On October 24, 2022, Hamilton voters will elect these offices:

Mayor

**15 City Councillors** 

11English Public School Board Trustees

9 English Separate School Board Trustees

1 French Public School Board Trustee

1 French Separate School Board Trustee



### Role of the Clerk

The City Clerk is responsible for <u>administering the election</u>, including developing policies and procedures that are necessary to conduct an election in a manner that reflects the principles of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996 (MEA) and its Regulations.

- (a) the secrecy and confidentiality of the voting process is paramount;
- (b) the election shall be fair and non-biased;
- (c) the election shall be accessible to the voters;
- (d) the integrity of the voting process shall be maintained throughout the election;
- (e) there is to be certainty that the results of the election reflect the votes cast;
- (f) voters and candidates shall be treated fairly and consistently; and
- (g) the proper majority vote governs by ensuring that valid votes are counted and invalid votes are rejected so far as reasonably possible



### Elections Team: What We Do

#### Plan and Deliver the Election, including:

- Ensuring alignment with the MEA
- Maintaining security and integrity of the system
- Recommending and administering Voting Methods
- Securing equipment and supplies
- Assessing and Securing Poll Locations
- Developing Procedures and Policies
- Hiring and Training of Poll Staff
- Communication
- Resource development
- Voter's List & Voter's Cards
- Certifying nominations
- Ordering and verifying ballots



### Elections Team: What We Don't Do

#### The Elections Team Does Not:

- Provide interpretation on legislation as it pertains to candidates or third parties
- Provide campaign advice or direction
- Share information on behalf of candidates or third parties
- Host debates
- Give advice on Finance and expenditures
- Contravene the Municipal Elections Act/Make Exceptions

### Nomination Package

### Nominations must include these completed documents:

- Nomination Form Form One
- Endorsement of Nomination Form Two (Council Only)
- Declaration of Qualification Council, School Board
- Release of Candidate Information Consent Form
- Request and Oath for Voter's List (if desired)
- Ballot Name and Name Pronunciation Form

#### Nominations must also include:

- Nomination filing fee
  - \$200 for candidates running for mayor and \$100 for councillor or school board trustee candidates
- Proof of Identification



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### **Nomination Submission Process**

### Nomination Packages must be Submitted in Person

- ➤ Appointments must be made to file nominations between May 2, 2022 to August 18, 2022.

- Candidates who wish to file a nomination on Nomination day, August 19, 2022, do not require an appointment
  - Nomination packages will be accepted at City Hall from 9 am to 2 pm
  - Packages from candidates who arrive after 2 pm on Nomination day will not be accepted

### **Election Signs**

### **By-Law Updated in 2022**

- Removed from the broader sign By-law as a schedule
- Modernized & Updated
- Aligned with Municipal Elections Act Third Party Sign Requirements
- Clarified election signs on City Property
- Addressed new mediums
- Clarification on where signs can be placed on private property

#### **Key Considerations**

- Election signs cannot be placed until 28 Days before voting day September 26,
  2022
- Election Signs must be removed within 72 hours of 11:59pm on Election Night –
  October 27, 2022, at 11:59pm all signs must be removed



### New for 2022

- Paperless
- E-poll Books & Electronic Strike-Off
- Special Vote by Mail
- Vote Anywhere Pilot
