
2021 POINT IN TIME SURVEY (Hamilton, Ontario)

The 2021 Point in Time (PIT) survey for Hamilton was led by the City of Hamilton – Housing Services Division and the Coalition of Hamilton Indigenous Leadership. Each PIT survey was completed by a community member currently experiencing homelessness in Hamilton.



NDIGENOUS RESPON

The responses shared in this infographic represent 2021 PIT respondents who self-identified as Indigenous or having Indigenous ancestry. *

Indigenous Peoples continue to be overrepresented among community members experiencing homelessness in Hamilton. Of Hamilton's general population, 2% of residents identify as Indigenous or having Indigenous ancestry. Among community members responding to Hamilton's 2021 PIT survey, 23% self-identified as Indigenous or having Indigenous ancestry.



Top 5 reported sources of


- 1. Disability benefit
- 2. Welfare/social assistance
- 3. Informal income (e.g., bottle returns, panhandling, family)
- 4. Employment (full or part-time)
- 5. Employment insurance

Top 5 reported causes for most recent loss of housing:

- 1. Unfit/unsafe housing condition
- 2. Not enough income for housing
- 3. Conflict with Spouse/Partner
- 4. Landlord/tenant conflict
- 5. Conflict with other

Top 5 challenges or experienced when trying to find housing:

- 1. Rent too high
- 2. Low Income
- 3. Poor Housing Conditions
- 4. Discrimination
- 5. Addiction



The 2021 Point in Time survey for Hamilton, Ontario was conducted during the week of November 15th through 19th. All 2021 PIT survey respondents in Hamilton were asked if they self-identified as First Nations (with or without status), Métis or Inuit or if they identified as having North American Indigenous ancestry.
