COUNCIL DIRECTION

In December 2019, Council directed staff to retain a consultant for the establishment of an independent Board of Directors for the Hamilton Anti-Racism Resource Centre (HARRC). Council also directed that the consultant establish a Community Advisory Panel to support project development (HUR18010(c)) (City Wide).

INFORMATION

A staff report to the Audit, Finance and Administration Committee on September 24, 2020, informed that EMpower Strategy Group was the successful consultant for the Hamilton Anti-Racism Resource Centre.

EMpower Strategy Group has now established a nine-member Community Advisory Panel (CAP), which is already meeting and supporting this initiative. The CAP members come from a variety of diverse backgrounds, lived-experiences and equity lenses essential to providing strategic advice, decision making and overall support. However, CAP members are ineligible to apply for the inaugural HARRC Board of Directors.
