



Play on Grade

This concept looks to break the park into multiple areas and movements throughout the space, giving user options to discover. At the center of the playground is a gathering plaza with a shade structure that is focused around the water play zone. Beyond the plaza is a series of different playrooms that accommodate different types of play. The play amenities have slight levels of separation and take advantage of grade changes. The style of this concept is more naturalistic in character.

In this concept the park is defined by a continuous movement into and through the space. Entering from the neighborhood, you're led into a small plaza that is separated from the play areas. Beyond here, you're taken up into the site to a more centrally located plaza that is positioned for multiple adjacent uses to utilize (baseball, concessions, etc.), while also anchoring the play areas and beyond an icon for the park. The main play areas are connected together for more unified playground feeling. The style of this concept is more organic in it's movements.
