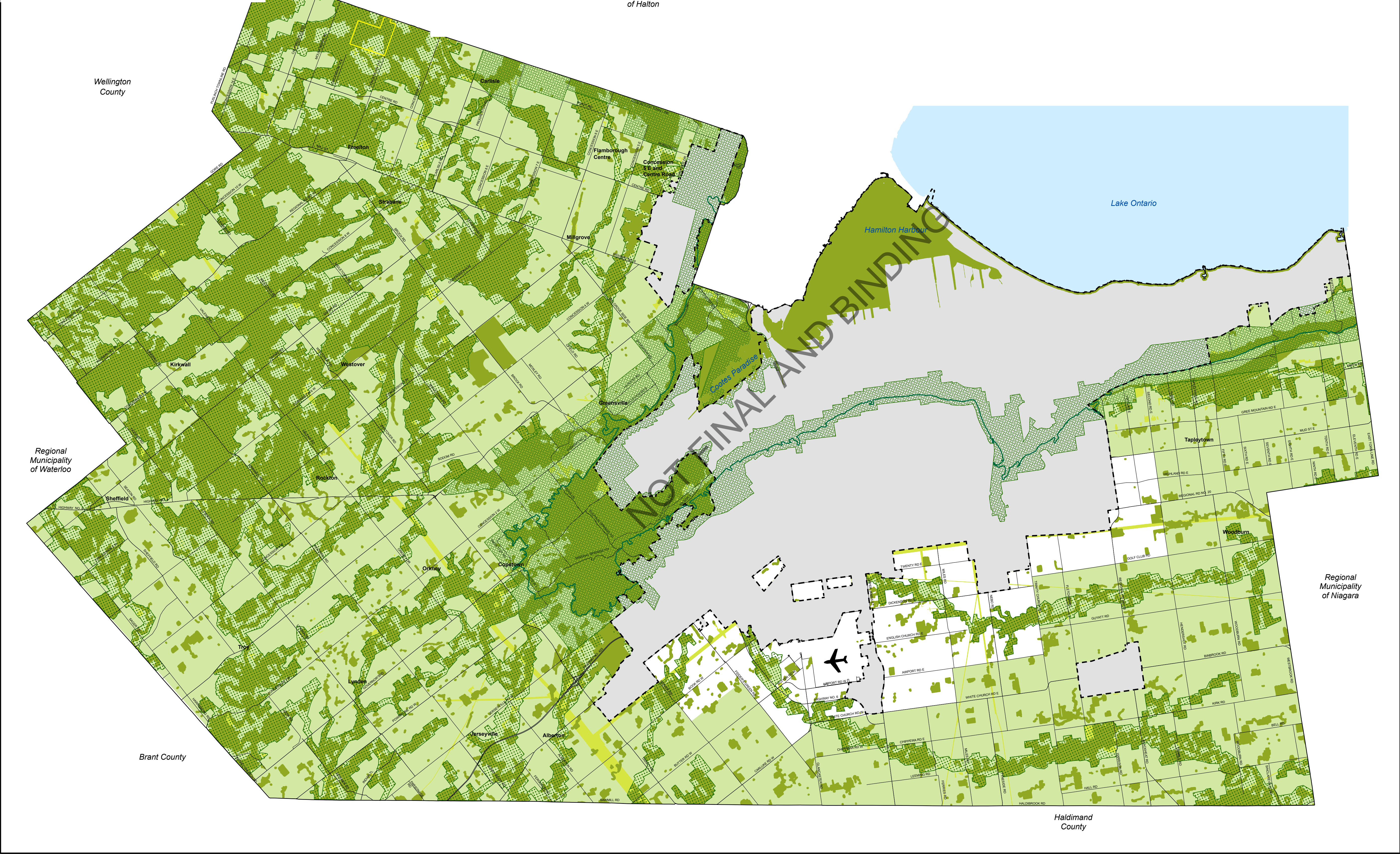

The four major types of wetlands are swamps, marshes, bogs and fens.
