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### **THE LIGHT RAIL TRANSIT SUB-COMMITTEE PRESENTS REPORT 16-003 AND RESPECTFULLY RECOMMENDS:**

- 1. Light Rail Transit (LRT) Property Acquisitions – Real Estate Services Protocol (PED16113/LS16011) (Item 8.1)**
  - (a) That the City of Hamilton enter into the Real Estate Services Protocol with Metrolinx, setting out the services to be provided by the City to Metrolinx to acquire real property required for the Hamilton Light Rail Transit (LRT) project, all funded by Metrolinx substantially in the form attached as Appendix A to the Light Rail Transit Sub-Committee Report 16-003; and

- (b) That the Mayor and Clerk be authorized and directed to execute the Real Estate Services Protocol, and any other ancillary documents, with content approved by the General Manager of Planning and Economic Development, in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor.

**2. Light Rail Transit (LRT) Alignment (PED16121) (Item 8.2)**

That PED Report 16121 respecting Light Rail Transit (LRT) Alignment, be received.

**3. Light Rail Transit (LRT) Alignment (PED16121) (Item 8.2)**

That the appropriate staff from Metrolinx and the City of Hamilton, in consultation with Steer Davies Gleave (the LRT consultant), investigate the feasibility of maintaining an International Village LRT stop, as was always contemplated, and report back to the LRT Sub-Committee.

Councillor Farr relinquished the Chair to Mayor Eisenberger in order to introduce the following motion:

WHEREAS, some important work is still ongoing as it relates to LRT alignment; and,

WHEREAS, the Executive Director and Members of the International Village Business Improvement Area (BIA) were, until the April 25<sup>th</sup>, 2016, release of the LRT Alignment Draft, under the impression that the International Village would be a destination on the LRT Line; and,

WHEREAS, at no other point along the LRT B-Line Route is there a “pinch point” as narrow as the International Village with only one lane of local access traffic eastbound thus making the International Village almost entirely on the LRT Route;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the appropriate staff from Metrolinx and the City of Hamilton, in consultation with Steer Davies Gleave (the LRT consultant), investigate the feasibility of maintaining an International Village LRT stop, as was always contemplated, and report back to the LRT Sub-Committee.

**(f) MOTIONS (Item 9)**

**(i) Feasibility of trial road closures or lane restrictions along the LRT Corridor (Item 9.1)**

Staff from the LRT Office – in consultation with appropriate staff from other Departments – were directed to report back to the LRT Sub-committee by the end of 2016 regarding the feasibility, costs and potential timing of road closures or lane restrictions on a trial basis to model the traffic impact on businesses and residents of the LRT alignment.
